
Democracy Act Solutions

Secret process that does not allow meaningful citizen input. Process is totally under the direction of one political party.

Citizens realize they cannot trust the government. We lose faith in a process where we have no input.

Detailed rules are used to enforce an open process. Draft maps are shared with the public. All meetings are open to the public.

The GA Constitution requires "contiguity" and same population for districts. No other standards protect against political influence.



No standards = distorted districts

Detailed standards
prevent maps that
distort local
communities and
conditions. Minorities
are protected. No undue
political influence is
allowed.

One political party creates maps to fit its desire to gather and keep power. The needs of citizens and of the State of Georgia are not factored into the process.

Unrepresentative
gerrymandered districts
are drawn to maintain
power of one party.
Incumbents are often
protected. Choice is
reduced for voters.

Maps will be drawn by an independent citizens' commission.

This multi-partisan commission must use unbiased standards in full view of the public with no involvement of politicians.
