

- #1 Citizens must have meaningful opportunities to learn about the maps being drawn and to give input into the design of those maps.
- #2 Draft maps have to be understandable to non-specialists.
- #3 An internet portal will be established to share draft maps, Commission communication, and other materials produced by the Commission.
- #4 Hearings have to be held in each congressional district with meaningful citizen input sought and followed.
- Information about the hearings and the process must be published in local newspapers in all congressional districts for people without internet access.
- #6 All meetings must be public. Commissioners and legislators or other political leaders cannot have private meetings for any purpose.
- #7 Citizens can file lawsuits if these transparency features are not followed.

Involve citizens in the whole process
