

**District referred to as “VRA Protected”: 2, 10, 15, 22, 26, 34, 35, 36, 38, 41, 43, 44, 55**

District 1:

- counties are whole within the district
- Eliminates additional county splits compared to current map
- Largely maintains the district core of prior district

District 2:

- Entirely within Chatham County
- Protects a community of interest
- Maintains an existing core of a district with a heavily minority influenced district

District 3: McIntosh, Glynn, Brantley, Camden, Charlton, Ware (Split)

- Coastal communities of interest

District 4:

- 5 whole counties with a split for population in Chatham County (Split)
- Maintains core of existing district that is under current map

District 5:

- Maintains minority opportunity district in Gwinnett
- Largely maintains core of existing district

District 6:

- Maintains core of existing district core of Fulton and Cobb counties
- Protects democratic incumbents
- Recognizes community of interest along the Chattahoochee River

District 7:

- Formerly in South Georgia (Senator Tyler Harper, not running for reelection)
- Moved to Gwinnett County area
- Formerly a Republican district, now a minority opportunity district in Gwinnett
- 65% of population is non-white
- 2<sup>nd</sup> highest Asian population district with 21.6%, recognizing the minority growth over the past decade

District 8:

- 6 whole counties, split in Ware County

District 9:

- Minority opportunity district
- Uses core of existing district

- Recognizes the growth in minority voters in Gwinnett

District 10:

- Protected by VRA
- Maintained district
- Core is primarily in Henry and DeKalb counties

District 11:

- Fairly unique run in South GA
- Consists of 7 whole counties
- Uses existing district as a baseline
- Mirrors Senate Democrats district

District 12:

- Maintains majority-minority district
- Uses only whole counties
- Centered in Albany area
- Mirrors Senate Democrats district

District 13:

- Takes up what used to be district 7
- Includes 8 whole counties with the only split in Coffee County
- Not a pairing district because Senator Harper is not running for reelection

District 14:

- Moved from Cherokee County into Fulton
- Another new district effectively because the current Senator is not running for reelection
- Heavily minority-influenced district
- Open seat

District 15:

- Protected by VRA, map maintains this
- Almost identical to district drawn by senate democrats

District 16:

- Not a lot of change
- 3 whole counties with part of Fayette County split
- Communities of interest south of Atlanta protected
- Existing district core maintained

District 17:

- Protects existing district cores because district already includes Henry and Newton County

- Added population in Walton and Morgan, which share a lot of commonalities with Newton and Henry around the ring of Atlanta

District 18:

- Largely the same as existing plan
- Includes 4 whole counties with a split in Macon-Bibb and Houston County
- Significant community of interest in the district, specifically around Macon

District 19:

- Another almost whole county district
- 10 whole counties with 1 split in Coffee County
- Community of interest: Montgomery, Toombs, Wheeler counties – residents stated it is known as the “Onion Belt”
- Has some changes due to district 7 moving north, but largely maintains existing district core

District 20:

- Largely maintains existing district, absorbs some geographical areas of district 7 due to it being moved
- 7 whole counties with 1 split in Houston

District 21:

- With movement of SD 14 into Fulton County, SD 21 took more Cherokee County
- Used most of district core
- Connects communities of interest in North Fulton with communities in Cherokee that share interests

District 22:

- Protected by VRA
- Maintained almost as it is currently
- Very similar to the footprint proposed by the Democrats

District 23:

- Kinda big
- A lot of counties – 9 whole counties, parts of Richmond and Columbia
- Shares connection with the Augusta region and is near the South Carolina border

District 24:

- Largely maintains existing footprint
- Adds Greene County
- Consists of 6 whole counties with only Columbia being split
- Lots of connection between rural counties that border South Carolina

District 25:

- Maintains most of existing district core
- Consist of 5 whole counties, with only Henry being divided
- Went into Henry to try to help for the population increase after removing Greene County from what was previously in district 25
- Includes Milledgeville and some lake areas, but mainly covers area from Henry County down to Macon

District 26:

- Protected by VRA
- District maintained, similar to what was proposed by Democrats
- 5 whole county districts with only Bibb and Houston being split
- Democratic proposal would have split an additional county

District 27:

- Forsyth County
- Maintains communities of interest – Forsyth Lake area and Asian community
- District has seen tremendous growth

District 28:

- Maintains Coweta-centered district
- Includes existing core plus a little of Douglas County, which is similar to Heard and Coweta County
- Consists of 2 whole counties and 2 split counties (Douglas and Fulton), while keeping Chattahoochee Hills
- Makes the city of palmetto within 1 single district
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District 29:

- Recognizes I-85 corridor going down to Columbus
- Including 3 whole counties, 1 split in north of Muscogee

District 30:

- Makes Carroll County whole, which is currently split
- It adds piece of Paulding and Douglas to add population numbers to get the district to the 191,000-ish mark
- It gets Harrellson County from district 31, which grew and makes room to make more of Paulding County whole
- Keeps communities of interest together

District 31:

- District grew population-wise
- New district utilizing existing district core

District 32:

- Had to adjust for population growth after moving SD 14
- SD 32 shifted West and North so now it largely runs along the I-75 corridor into Cherokee County and connects North Cobb and to the Cherokee portion that is a community of interest

District 33:

- Community of interest in South Cobb and Powder Springs, up to Marietta
- Largely maintains existing district core

District 34:

- VRA Protected district

District 35:

- VRA protected
- Uses existing footprint
- Similar to Democrat plan

District 36:

- VRA protected
- Sits on border of Fulton and DeKalb
- Maintained existing core
- Similar to Democrat plan

District 37:

- Back into Cobb
- Community of interest in South Cobb up into Bartow County
- District largely mirrors existing district core, but shifts slightly north with configuration of Cobb and Cherokee counties

District 38:

- VRA protected
- Maintained existing district core
- Straddles Fulton into Cobb, along the river
- Includes Truist Park and the Battery
- Similar configuration to the Democrats map

District 39:

- Primarily in existing core configuration
- Similar to what the democrats proposed

District 40:

- Primarily North DeKalb County
- Maintained existing core district, including part that crossed slightly over into Gwinnett

District 41:

- VRA protected
- Able to maintain existing district and match up with Democrat proposed map
- It consists of areas of DeKalb that share some commonality with Gwinnett County

District 42:

- Largely matches the democratic plan with the boundaries along the border of DeKalb and Fulton

District 43:

- VRA protected
- Maintained existing district core in DeKalb, Rockdale, and Newton counties
- Closely resembles Democrats proposed district

District 44:

- All in Clayton County
- VRA Protected
- Configuration maintains core of existing district and closely matches democrat proposal

District 45:

- With changes in SD 38, it pushed SD 45 out of Gwinnett a little bit and more into Barrow County
- Strong connection with the northern parts of Gwinnett County and similarity with Barrow County

District 46:

- Largely Athens suburb communities of interest and includes Clarke County

District 47:

- Largely maintains existing district core
- Takes more of Clarke County

District 48:

- Shifted a little from Fulton into Forsyth and Gwinnett
- Now includes Johns Creek and some of the faster growing areas of Forsyth that share a common interest with Gwinnett

- Largely a suburban district that has a lot of continuing growth

District 49:

- Maintains the historic SD 49 with all of the district located within Hall County
- District has been in that place for a long time and this map continues that placement

District 50:

- Contains community of interest with the mountains and areas along the South Carolina border
- Largely whole counties with just a few splits for population
- 6 whole counties with splits for white, hall, and Jackson

District 51:

- 6 whole counties with only White County being split
- Mountainous area with similar communities of interest
- During public hearing tour, Pickens County folks asked that county be put together, rather than split as it currently is

District 52:

- Protects current district core and communities of interest that you find in Bartow and Floyd County
- Attempts to keep Bartow County whole

District 53:

- Chattanooga border communities of interest
- Adds population in Floyd to get to correct population numbers

District 54:

- Two whole counties: only Gordon County is split
- NW GA communities of interest

District 55:

- VRA protected
- Largely matches Dem plan

District 56:

- Connects Roswell with east Cobb into Cherokee County
